Daive Vignato, Garganega, Veneto, Italy; White Wine

Garganega (Italian: [gar'ga:nega], meaning "from Gargano") is a variety of white Italian wine grape widely grown in the Veneto region of North East Italy, particularly in the provinces of Verona and Vicenza. It is Italy's 6th most widely planted white grape. It forms the basis of Venetian white wine Soave.

La Capranera, Falanghina

Hails from the Campania region in Italy. This delightful white wine offers a perfect blend of cedar with tropical notes and subtle accents of banana. It pairs wonderfully with fresh cheeses like Mozzarella di Bufala and is also an excellent choice alongside shellfish.

Araldica, D'Alba, Piedmont, Italy; Red Wine

Ruby red with purple highlights. Elegant bouquet on the nose with aromas of cherries and plums with an enticing warm, spiced and smoky sensation. The palate is rich and generous with juicy cherry, plum fruit and meaty, spicy notes beneath. Soft oak tannins offer an extra dimension to the texture. A refreshing smack of fruity acidity on the finish gives plenty of definition to the ripe fruit.

Barbera is a red Italian wine grape variety from the Piedmont region, considered the people's wine of consumption by the locals. Barbera is the third most-planted red grape variety in Italy. When young, the wines offer a very intense aroma of fresh red cherries and blackberries

Camigliano, Brunello Di Montalcino (Bottle Only)

Chef Steve personally visited this winery on his recent trip to Italy and fell in love with this winery, very small production, well cared for winery with lots of love personally attended to the wines, This wine is a Ruby red wine, tending to a very lively garnet. It has an intense and persistent, ample and ethereal scent. Small ripe red fruits are highlighted together with spicy notes. On the palate the tannins are balanced and soft with an excellent aromatic persistence.

Brunello di Montalcino is made from the Sangiovese grapes, and is grown in the region of Tuscany. Flavors and aromas of red and black fruit with underlying vanilla, earth tones and spice hints.

Get to Know Our Italian Wines

Prosecco is made from Glera grapes and is a dry sparkling style wine, from the town of prosecco in the Valdobbiadene hills in the Veneto region specifically, Italy's creation of a version of champagne and much cheaper.

Pinot Grigio is from the Veneto region in the northeast part of Italy, is a dry white wine grape, has a burst of lemon, lime, green apple and honeysuckle.

Moscato is the Italian word for the muscat family of grapes, and frequently refers to a lightly sparkling, low-alcohol sweet white wine. With flavors of citrus, stone fruit, and orange blossom.

Soave is a dry white Italian wine from the Veneto region, principally around the city of Verona, Throughout the Soave production zone, Garganega is the principal grape variety, tastes of peach, honeydew, green apple, citrus and sweet marjoram.

Amarone Della Valpolicella is a rich dry red wine made from the partially dried Corvina grapes, baked on the roofs in the sunshine, Valpolicella is in the province of Verona, aromas of cherry, black fig and green peppercorns.

Nebbiolo is an Italian red wine grape variety predominantly associated with its native Piedmont region, where it grows. Nebbiolo produces lightly-colored red wine. As they age, the wines take on a characteristic brick-orange hue at the rim of the glass and mature to reveal other aromas and flavors such as violets, tar, wild herbs, cherries, raspberries, truffles, tobacco, and prunes.

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Barolo is often described as the "King of Wines" from being served to royalty. Barolo is made from Nebbiolo grapes and needs to be aged for at least 36 months after the harvest before release. Aromas and flavors of tar and rose, truffles, chocolate, eucalyptus and leather.

Barbaresco is an Italian wine made with the Nebbiolo grape. Barbaresco is produced in the Piedmont region in an area of the Langhe immediately to the east of Alba and specifically in the communes of Barbaresco village. Aromas and flavors of cherry, truffles, fennel and licorice.

Sangiovese is the most produced grape in Italy, Tuscany is the region it mostly grows in, but can be found all over Italy and now in the USA and Australia the backbone for many varieties of wines, Chianti, Brunello di Montalcino, Vino Nobile di Montepulciano. It has flavors and aromas of cherry, strawberry, dried herbs, balsamic vinegar and smoke.

Chianti is any wine produced with Sangiovese grapes that must come from the Chianti region of central Tuscany, Italy. It was historically associated with a squat bottle enclosed in a straw basket, called a *fiasco* (*Flask*), however, the *fiasco* is only used by a few makers of the wine these days as most Chianti is now bottled in more standard shaped wine bottles. Flavors and aromas of cherry, strawberry, dried herbs, balsamic vinegar and smoke.

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
